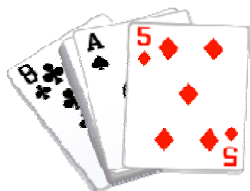

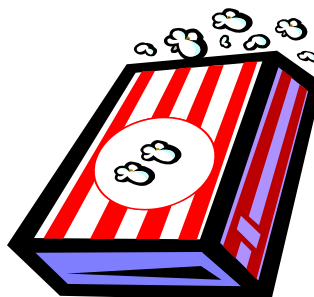

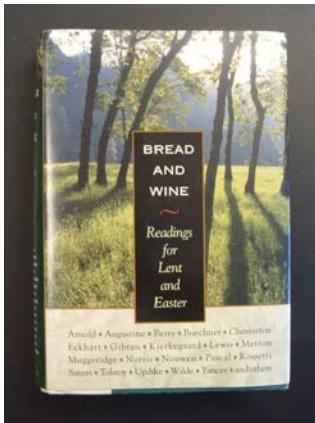

From the Interim Pastor

Lent begins March 9th. This year we will be using the book Bread and Wine. It's a wonderful book of devotions for the season. The author's are a "Who's Who" of the faith: Walter Wangerin, William Willimon, Kathleen Norris, Edna Hong, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Soren Kierkegaard, Blaise Pascal, Martin Luther, G.K. Chesterton, Mother Teresa,

Saint Augustine, John Stott, Brennan Manning, Paul Tillich, C.S. Lewis, Frederick Buechner, Karl Barth, Madeleine L'Engle, Philip Yancy, Leo Tolstoy, Fyodor Dostoevsky, Henri Nouwen and many more. You'd be hard pressed to find a better collection any place. Publishers Weekly described it as "Hardhitting and beautifully written, featuring Christendom's most celebrated masters."

Sunday and Wednesday worship services and sermons will be based on the readings from this book. This is the fourth time I've used this during Lent. I've been assured by many that even if you don't buy the book and read along, you'll be able to participate fully in worship. But if you do choose to buy it and read along, you'll be all the more enriched.

My hope is that you'll read it and talk with others about what strikes you. There's been lots of "talk" at OSL this past year or so. Talk about the readings in this book will be much more edifying.

The books will be for sale at church on Sunday mornings and in the office during the week. The price is \$15.00. They list for \$18.00 plus tax, but because we are buying them in bulk, we received a lower price. If you can't afford the \$15.00, pay what you can. I've also prepared a Reading Guide to go with the book. It includes a related Scripture passage for each day, printed out in full for your convenience; a glossary of terms, as some are a bit esoteric or dated, and an image and a bit of information about each author. FAIR TRADE PRODUCTS at our Savior's Lutheran Church

Enjoyed your Valentine's Day chocolate? I did! Was it Fair Trade Certified? Do not know. How to tell, that is the question.

Our Savior's Women underwrites the sales of Fair Trade products at OSLC. This includes coffee (regular and decaf), chocolate (candy bars and hot chocolate) and tea which are available in OSLC office and on the cart in the Friendship Room. Payment is an "on-your-honor" basis via locked boxes by both areas with a slot on top to insert your money.

Why Fair Trade products? Because farmers receive directly a guaranteed price for their goods and the security of long-term trading contracts. This allows millions of people around the world to stay on their land, put food on the table and keep kids in school. Products marked Fair Trade mean the supply chain is "cleaned up"--no child labor/slavery--no raping the environment.

The Ivory Coast is the world's largest cocoa producer with some 1.8 million (YIKES—MILLION!) children ages 5-17 are working on cocoa farms. Only about 5% of the children are paid for their work and 40% are not in schools. See *Leader-Telegram* 2-15-11 page 6A, "Critics: Chocolate trade has bitter impact".

This last year OSLC had Fair Trade product sales of about \$1,500, while other past years sales have been over \$2,000. Coffee is by far the most popular item. Our prices for the Fair Trade products will now be *slightly* increased due to an increase in our cost. Markup is a modest 10% as our aim is to promote Fair Trade products and NOT to make money.

Fair Trade means clean water, better school and healthcare in Ghana.

Our Savior's Luther Church Annual Meeting Sunday, February 13, 2011

At 12:17 pm Interim Pastor Mark Hendrickson led the assembled members of the congregation with devotions.

With the absence of a counsel, Pastor Hendrickson then called the meeting to order. Attendance sheets were circulated for signatures.

Due to the absence of a counsel, the congregation unanimously consented to appoint Leslie Frost, synod parliamentarian, to preside at the meeting. The congregation also gave unanimous consent to Deanna Applehans to serve as secretary pro tem and Chris Lemke to serve as timekeeper. The congregation adopted the agenda.

The rules of procedure were read to the congregation. A motion was made by Arvin Solsaa to accept the rules of procedure as read. The motion was seconded. No discussion followed. Motion carried.

The secretary reports were printed in the annual report. A motion was made by Arvin Solsaa to accept the reports as written. The motion was seconded. No discussion followed. Motion carried.

Pastor Hendrickson gave the Interim Pastor report.

New Business:

Pastor Don Wisner gave the report of the nominating committee. Seven members agreed to have their names placed on the OSL Church Council. The floor was opened to additional nominations. The following people were nominated: Calvin Christianson, Steve Terry, Ken Applehans, Harry Stai, Jane Kingszett, David Schiotz.

The newly nominated individuals moved to the Friendship room to be informed by Pastor Wisner, representing the nominating committee, as to the expectations of council members if elected.

A motion was made by Arden Alexander to elect 12 members of council and the length of each person's term to be determined by the most received votes having 3 year terms and the least amount of votes to hold the one year terms. The motion was seconded. Pat Brogan and Barb Lindberg spoke in opposition to the motion. No further discussion. Motion was defeated.

A motion was made by Audric Buhr to establish the church council for 2011 with 9 members. The motion was seconded. Motion carried.

Nominations were opened for Northwest Synod of Wisconsin Assembly Delegates. With no nominations, Arden Alexander moved that the 4 Synod Assembly delegates be selected by the church council for 2011. The motion was seconded. Motion carried.

Nominations were opened for the Luther Park Annual meeting representatives. No nominations were added from the floor. Nominations were closed.

Nominations were opened for the nominating committee. No nominations were added from the floor. Nominations were closed.

Nominations were opened for the Lutheran campus board. No nominations were added from the floor. Nominations were closed.

Nominations were opened for the American Lutheran Homes. No nominations were added from the floor. With no nominations the responsibility to select someone to serve will be given to the church council.



Report of the budget was presented by Tom Johnson and Arvin Solsaa. The budget for 2011 is \$390,224.66. Discussion followed. A motion was made by Tom Johnson and Arvin Solsaa to approve the budget. The motion was seconded. Motion carried.

The vote for council members and other positions was held via paper ballots. The tellers took the ballots for counting. A brief recess was held at 1:36 pm

At 1:50 the meeting reconvened with other new business.

Arden Alexander moved for the adoption of the following:

WHEREAS, there is widespread disillusionment by many Lutherans church wide as well as within Our Saviors Lutheran Church it seems advisable to explore our options in regard to the possibility of severing our ELCA affiliation, and
WHEREAS, time is of the essence to allow the many members who are considering leaving OSLC to delay their decision until this issue is resolved by the congregation making a final decision.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

The congregation of Our Saviors Lutheran Church directs the Church Council to:

1. Organize a forum to include invitations to representatives of NALC (North American Lutheran Church) and LCMC (Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ) to provide information to interested members of OSLC;
2. Following these forums, offer our members a congregational meeting to discuss and vote on these options; and,
3. Further, due to our financial difficulties, withhold all synodical financial support to the ELCA until the above process is complete.

Following the reading of the proposal, Penny Boselmann voiced an objection to the consideration of the proposal. With an objection on the floor a two-thirds majority vote to agree (yes) or disagree (no) with the objection was required for passage. The voice vote was inconclusive. A ballot vote was then taken. Of 145 votes cast, 112 agreed with the objection (yes), 33 disagreed (no). The objection prevailed.

The results of the election were as follows: 170 members attending, 164 ballots cast. 83 votes were required as a minimum to be elected. Nine individuals had 83 or more votes.

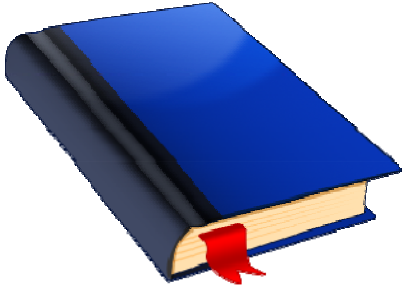
