Newspaper Pick Up

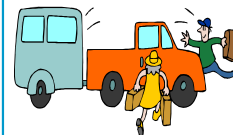

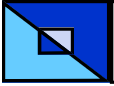
Thanksgiving Eve Service

MIDDLE SCHOOL YOUTH GROUP

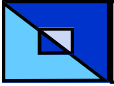

From the Transition Task Force:

Thanks to all of you who attended the Interim Journey Forums on Sunday, October 23! The discussion was good and we gleaned many helpful thoughts that will be used in the preparation of the Ministry Site Profile, which is the document we need to prepare for the process of getting a new pastor. (The document was previously called the Congregational Ministry Profile.) The Ministry Site Profile is used by the synod staff to better understand a congregation's identity, mission and vision, and expressed preferences in the pastor they seek; as well as by candidates for the call to determine if they want to engage in the process and, if so, to prepare for it.

The next issue we'll address in a forum is "The Role of the Pastor."

We are working to determine the best way to facilitate a group event on this topic. As soon as we know how we're going to proceed, we'll set a date for a gathering (or gatherings) and publicize it.

To prime your pump on this issue, consider these questions:

Which of each of these pairs (a or b) do you think is most important for the pastor to do?

- a) Do more visiting with shut-ins
- b) Put more time into sermon preparation

- a) Attend a wedding anniversary reception
- b) Go on a retreat with parish staff

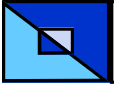
- a) Call on prospective members

MEETING MINUTES**

October 11, 2011, 7:00 p.m. – Fireside Room

Present: Jenna Creaser, Lisa Brogan, Troy Peickert, Amy Eitrhein, Mark Kalscheur, Scott Barnhart, Pastor Mark Hendrickson, Barb Lindberg, Calvin Christianson

Guests: Brad Waznik, Marni Waznik, Jeff Ohvall

Meeting called to order by Amy Eitrhein at 7:05 p.m.

1. Call to order – priority agenda

- A. Adoption of agenda-additions or corrections: Troy/Cal made a motion to approve the agenda. Motion carried.
- B. Devotions: Pastor Mark led discussion of Chapter 7 of the Peter L. Steinke book read by council members.
- C. Personnel committee report (w/o): The Personnel Committee ministry charge was discussed with a few changes to be made. An updated version will be sent to council members post the meeting electronically. Since January several positions have been filled, currently no positions are open. The committee is pending a projected 2012 budget, waiting for assistance of the Transition Task Force committee staff needs assessment. The recommendation is to make sure OSL is utilizing best practices with the hiring process. Also recommends making sure Personnel Committee is participatory with the Call Committee.
- D. Finance committee report (w/o): Checking account balance as of 9/30/11 is \$1,698.82. As of 9/30/11 YTD our disbursements exceeded receipts by \$23,862.18. Currently 41 members participate in the Simply Giving program for contributions. Brian LaVoy, from Waznik Moseler Group, LLC, provided a recommendation to the Finance Committee about the current investment fund performance. The firm has graciously provided their services with no fee.
 - i. A 2012 proposed budget was discussed. A special Finance Committee will be occurring soon to review the proposed budget with detail.
 - ii. Offering envelopes have been available to pick up at church for the last two months. Volunteers will be assisting to make phone calls to see if envelopes should continue to be sent and are accurately sent to the appropriate members. Once the list is cleaner, the next step is to establish a process to identify the frequency of mailing envelopes to members.
 - iii. Thank you to Tim Lehmann for his assistance with updating the computer systems.
- E. Council terms: Nominating committee – the three one year term council members have the option to give their name for additional terms, and two one year term members must sit on the nominating committee. Call committee – the council will make a recommendation to the congregation on the formation of the Call Committee when the time to do so arrives.
- F. Team Building – (1) Thank you's – Troy Peickert will complete (2) Serve coffee on 10/23 – Council has been asked to serve coffee on October 23, 2011, when the TTF will be giving a interim presentation. Several council members stated they will be present.
 - i. A motion was made by Troy/Cal to have the ushers assist in the responsibility of picking up the offering after each service, a list will be provided to the ushers of all council members and after each service to find one member to put money away in the safe. Set up an initial log in the office for who was responsible for putting the monies away. Ushers are responsible to replace the simply giving cards after each service. Motion carried. Scott Barnhart will follow up with Tim Lehmann.
- G. Safe Kids policy: The policy states to conduct background checks on all teachers and instructors. Marni Waznik provided information about conducting the background checks through the Wisconsin Department of Justice. Recommendation is to have Education Committee create a risk level hierarchy of who should receive the background checks.
- H. Ken Applehans resignation: Motion made to accept the resignation by Mark/Lisa. Motion carried.
 - i. Motion was made by Cal/Troy to fill the vacating position on council at the next annual meeting in 2012. Motion carried.
 - ii. Motion was made by Amy/Troy to have Scott Barnhart fill the interim vice president position. Motion carried.
- I. Transition Task Force Update and discussion – Jeff Ohvall presented and discussed the TTF update. The team has been meeting frequently. An OSL's Interim Journey template was distributed and discussed. Motion was made by Scott/Cal to approve the OSL Interim Journey publication and distribute to the congregation. Motion carried. The journey will be introduced to the congregation next Sunday, and will be posted on the bulletin board under the skylight as well as in several places throughout the building.
- J. Lutheran Campus Ministry update: Pastor Kurt Larson and Tim Schroeder have discussed with council members about worshipping with OSL on Sunday mornings instead of an evening worship. Also, they are seeking further congregational connections with supporting any additional ministries.
- K. Pastor's Report: Stewardship letters will be mailed out on Thursday, October 13, 2011. Stewardship Campaign will occur on October 16, October 23, and November 13, and November 20 with emphasis during worship with temple talks, announcements, etc.
- L. Concealed Weapon Law: the synod website provided the adequate information for what. The property management committee will discuss with legal advice about OSL's position.

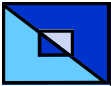

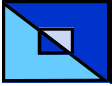

Speaking the Language of Faith

Erika Randall remembers that her time in Malaysia always began with a short walk under the hot sun (about 15 steps) followed by greetings (“Good morning, Teacher!”) and hugs from her students.

It was a quick commute to a job that was very far from home.

The 23-year-old from Minnesota taught English to children in Malaysia for a year as a young adult volunteer with the ELCA.

Her students, ages 6 to 13 years, eagerly soaked up their lessons. So did Erica, who considered herself as much a student as a teacher.

She gained some proficiency in Malay, the local language, with enthusiastic tutoring from the children in her classes.

Part of learning a new language, Ericka discovered, was being open to the uniqueness of each person speaking the language and to the nuances of the culture that frame the words.

Taking that step asked Erika to engage in one-one-one relationships with her students—a task the Luther College graduate relishes.

“At first, I had a difficult time teaching the students, and I think it was because we just didn’t get each other,” Erika confesses.

“I realized I had to really listen and really hear the children. I learned the hard way about the value of making relationships and getting to know people as individuals.”

Most important, Erika adds, is that “we grew together. I loved those kids! They taught me that patience and conversations are the most important characteristics in developing relationships, especially in a cross-cultural setting.”

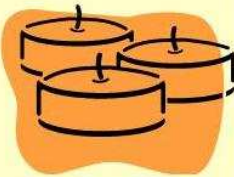

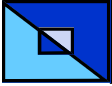

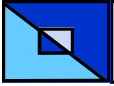

Each family is unique and so is their adoption journey. Many families have experienced other journeys before looking to build their family through adoption. Many children hope their journey leads them to a forever family of their own. Learn more about the Else family and their adoption journey below:

The Else Family's Adoption Journey

David and Kimberly Else have been strong advocates for children since adopting their son, Christopher, from the Philippines in 2000. They worked patiently through a total of four adoptions, each with unique struggles that included both passport and health issues and typhoon flooding. Dave and Kim were committed to adopting older children with full knowledge that there could be a long and sometimes difficult adjustment period. They tenaciously seek educational opportunities and stability for the children, accepting each as an individual with special gifts. After Kim's bout with breast cancer, the couple's second adoption application was rejected. However, in late 2006, the family eagerly agreed to participate in the LSS Adoption Ambassadors Program that advocates for the adoption of older and special needs children in the Philippines.





Upon arriving in the Philippines in 2007 and seeing Christopher interacting with a nine-year-old boy named Waren, Kim and Dave knew they had not only found their new son, but also their daughter, 13-year-old Julie. Julie and Waren struggled to adjust, but Kim and David's unwavering love helped them find the light at the end of the tunnel. In 2009, 7-year-old Nica was welcomed home, completing the family. Due to the fact that their children were older when they joined the family, Dave and Kim have been tireless in their pursuit of opportunities to keep the children connected with the Philippines. They are members of several cultural groups, keep in close contact with former orphanage roommates, and the children can proudly say they are world-class athletes in the Filipino martial art of Eskrima/Doce Pares. While Kim keeps the Else home comfortable and stable, David honorably serves as a Department of Defense Civilian and Colonel in the U.S. Marine Corps, traveling frequently to the Middle East to share his expertise. Dave and Kim are proud parents of four fantastic children, and they are humbled by the praise they receive for their hard work.

US Senator Herb Kohl has selected David and Kimberly Else as a 2011 Angel in Adoption awardee for their outstanding advocacy of adoption issues. The Congressional Coalition on Adoption Institute (CACI), which orchestrates the Angel in Adoption program, honored David and Kimberly Else, along with more than 150 Angels, at an awards ceremony and gala event in Washington, DC, this past October. 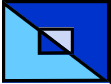
